

Prompts (Pick ONE):

1. Who is the most to blame, Odysseus or Polyphemus (cyclops), for the conflicts that led to the deaths of 6 men? Why?
2. Should Odysseus have warned his men about Scylla and Charybdis, or kept it a secret from them? Why?
3. Is Odysseus a hero? If so, why? If not, why not?



C.S.E.A.C.T. Step	Write 1-2 Sentences for each step.
Claim	Odysseus did the right thing by not telling the men about scylla and charybdis.
Set-Up	
Evidence/Quote	“I told them nothing, as they could do nothing, they would have dropped their oars again. In panic, to roll over for cover under decking”
Analysis	This evidence shows that if Odysseus told them about scylla and charybdis they would have panicked about it and dropped everything with Odysseus needed the men.
Counterclaim ("In contrast, some would say that ...")	He could have told the men about Odysseus and they could have been prepared but he did what he had to do not to cause panic .
